This Public Charitable Trust Deed is made at Delhi on 23rd day of April, 2019 by Shaji Jacob S/o Mr. Philipose Jacob R/o WZ-332, Basai Darapur, Near CNI Church, Ramesh Nagar, West Delhi-110015; hereinafter called the 'SETTLER' (which expression shall unless excluded by or repugnant to the subject or context be deemed to include his heirs, executors, administrators, assigns and representatives) of the ONE PART and.....



WHEREAS the Settler is desirous to establish a Public Charitable Trust for general welfare of humanity. The Trustees have at the request of Settler agreed to act as Trustees of these presents upon the terms and provisions hereinafter contained.

#### NOW THIS TRUST DEED WITNESSES AS FOLLOWS:

[1] In order to effectuate the said object of creating and establishing a Public Charitable Trust, the settler has delivered to and made over to the Trustees a sum of Rs. 2,100/- (Rupees Two thousand one hundred only) with intent to part with all his rights, title and interest claim therein and vest the same in the Trustees to have and to hold the same and the investment or investments for the time being representing the same and all other properties that may for the time being represent the Trust estate together with all additions and accretions thereto and all accumulated income thereof and all other property or properties that may be acquired out of the same or otherwise may hereafter be subject to the Trust (hereinafter referred to as 'THE TRUST FUND') for the charitable objects and purposes and uses hereinafter expressed with the powers and on the terms and conditions herein contained or the concerning the same.

# [2] NAME of the Trust shall be: "HUMAN RIGHTS CORPS"

[3] REGISTERED OFFICE of the Trust shall be situated at: RZ-B/176, F/F, Indra Park, Uttam Nagar, New Delhi-110059 which may be changed from time to time to such other place or places as the Trustees may deem fit and proper at their discretion.

#### [4] WORKING AREA: ALL OVER INDIA.

[4A] The Trust could have its unit offices at any place in all over India.

[5] Those who are Trustees for the purpose and declares that founder (Shaji Jacob) will continue to be the Executive Trustee of the Trust and one of the Trustees for his life time.

#### [6] The objects of the Trust shall be:

- 1. To give awareness about Human Rights & Consumer Forum and to give education about right of every citizen.
- 2. To protect the people for Corruption of civic bodies and Consumer Affairs, Civil Defence, Jan Shikayar Kendra/ RTI/Investigation services etc.,
- 3. To follow, adopt & promote Universal Declaration of Human Rights of United Nations and Indian Constitution & National –International Law.
- 4. To stop the illegal activities. To enhance awareness about formal/informal method of Welfare, Terrorism, Corruption & Education.
- 5. To work for Human Rights & Social Justice, to save the historical places.
- 6. To prevent Human Rights violations to safeguard the Fundamental Rights of every citizens of India and to make sure that Social Justice is achieved and done to all in every aspect.
- 7. To make people aware about their Human Rights and Consumer Forum to make available the cheap and affordable Legal advise to needy.
- 8. To promote & educate Equality, as well as Equity, Brotherhood, Non-Violence, Love, Peace, Justice, Protection & Promotion of Human Rights for all
- 9. To suggest action for violation of rights by armed political groups and terrorists.
- 10. To create an environment as well as an understanding that Human Rights can easily become vulnerable to abuse of various structures and processes of power and to examine the inter-dependence of and linkage between Human Rights and democracy, pluralism, development, ecological balance, peace and harmony at the national levels.
- 1. To make people aware of "Human Rights duties", privileges, conduct training camps & workshops, establish old age homes, residential/vocational schools & colleges, research & medical colleges and Human Rights Camps.





12. To promote social progress and better standards of life and activity in cooperation with the Government of India and other countries to promote human rights education.

13. To develop a more distinctive and effective role for the Court of Justice to fulfill the Human Rights and spread the messages/values of Human Rights by

way of Human Rights education.

14. To establish and conduct centers of treatment and rehabilitation for the victims of violators of Human Rights.

15. To actively join hands with the Government of India and other countries to promote Human Rights education and help legal, social and economic discrimination against women and their exploitation in different ways.

16. To publish books, encyclopedias, monographs, journals and directories on

Human Rights and study and prepare reports on the violation, etc.

17. To effectively work for gender inequalities, exploitations and injustice as also to encourage / assist talented artists, poets, singers, writers, social workers, journalists, doctors, judges, etc.

18. To organize and participate in cultural programmes to foster a spirit of nationalism to achieve co-operation in solving various problems of economic, social, cultural or humanitarian character and in promoting and encouraging respect for human rights.

19. To take up main law full step for Anti Corruption, and Crime, detective and Dowry system, and all type corruption cases etc.

20. To aware people about Right to Information Act, 2005.

21. To get and collect information & datas from Govt. departments, Private companies, Civic bodies etc through RTI Act (Right to information Act).

22. To appoint RTI activists in National, State, Distt, Taluka, Panchayat etc levels in all over India.

23. To arrange and organize Lectures, debates, discussion and seminars for the awareness of Rules and Regulation of law.

24. To how proper and Right chain to people for escalating their problems and needs.

25. To establish one high facilities full maintains medical Hospital & Human rights Training college for the upliftment & basic education development of the down trodden, weaker section, SC/ST, Section minorities groups, General poor Girls, widows, women, old-aged Laborer/Labor.

26. To take legal actions against anti-human rights, anti-nation, terrorism work/activities under the healthy direction of the central/state Govt. with

public mass movement.

To run legal helping camps, public awareness programmes with the assistance of Distt. Justice services, National Legal service/ National Women Commission/ National Human Rights Commission to help the victims. To carry the complete information about all the laws and bills passed by the Govt. of India and United Nations organization-U.N.O Head Offices from time to time and to do the legal action with the help of the concerned Govt. competent authorities.



28. To take legal actions under National Legal service Authority against private school, college, convent and other private institute, nursing home, hospital, clinic and chemist shops who is playing without any licence or corporation licence throughout the country.

29. Thus we all are consumers in the literal sense of the term. When we approach the market as a consumer, we expect value for money, i.e., right quality, right quantity, right prices, information about the mode of use, etc. But there may be

instances where a consumer is harassed or cheated.

30. The Government understood the need to protect consumers from unscrupulous suppliers, and several laws have been made for this purpose. We have the Indian Contract Act, the Sale of Goods Act, the Dangerous Drugs Act, the Agricultural Produce (Grading and Marketing) Act, the Indian Standards Institution (Certification Marks) Act, the Prevention of Food Adulteration Act, the Standards of Weights and Measures Act, etc. which to some extent protect consumer interests. However, these laws require the consumer to initiate action by way of a civil suit involving lengthy legal process which is very expensive and time consuming.

31. The consumer Protection Act, 1986 was enacted to provide a simpler and quicker access to redressal of consumer grievances. It is interesting to note that the Act doesn't seek to protect every consumer within the literal meaning of the term. The protection is meant for the person who fits in the definition of

'consumer' given by the Act.

32. To create awareness among the general public to fight against Corruption and crime and terrorism activities.

- 33. Propaganda against corruption, through Print/Electronic Media Camps, Membership drive. To fight against Communal and anti-national forces.
- 34. To make awareness of the youth for the national sprit and promote them to work for the safeguard of the nation.
- 35. To help the Government Agencies and apprise them about the suspicious persons moving in the public.
- 36. To arrange and provide basic training programme of safe guarding the general public by proper civil defense from time to time.
- 37. Support to voluntary organization network which are working in the field of justice, peace, health and community development and at the same time to improve the relationship amongst the people and to uplift the members financially and to improve jobs in social for the trust.
- 38. To suggest national and international leads alternative approaches to the solution activities and to take steps for the general welfare.
- 39. To promote RTE (Right to educate) in urban and rural areas to aware people about this.
- 40. To organize seminar, workshops and camps to give information about RTE in all over India.
- 41. To take up effective but reasonable and lawful steps for the eradication of social devils such as dowry-system, early aged marriage (Bal Vivah), Child labour and use of intoxicated Drugs, Wine, Smack etc.









- 42. To open, found, establish, promote, set up, run, maintain, assist, finance support and/or help the various Community development programs/activities and also construct and develop the community halls, Marriage homes, Pio, Rest House/Vishram Greh, Night Shelters, Old aged homes, Orphanage, Low cost houses for poor/homeless, Shochalay, Anganwari, Balwari, Mahila Ashram and other buildings for use of general public and for welfare of the General Public.
- 43. To help poor persons in marriage of their sons and daughters by way of cash donation or otherwise and to distribute clothes, food and other necessaries of daily life amongst the poor, orphan and indigent persons.
- 44. To work for the protection & development of the Wild life, birds and environment (tree planting) etc. especially planting of fruit trees.
- 45. To open, found, establish, promote, set up, run, maintain, assist, finance, support and/or aid or help in the setting up and/or maintaining and/or running hospitals, charitable dispensaries, physiotherapy centres, mobile dispensaries, maternity homes, child welfare centres and other similar institutions or centres for rendering or providing medical relief.
- 46. To make arrangements for mobile emergency Van/ambulance for the victims of road accidents, to provide help to pregnant ladies to shift them to near by hospital, also to provide assistance to the old people for the emergency.
- 47. To provide nursing aid to the needy people especially for the Old age men and women, orphan, ill etc.
- 48. To open centres/institutes for diagnostic curative and research of Cancer, AIDS, T.B. and other deadly diseases.
- 49. To arrange and organize EYE, BLOOD donation, and all other Medical camps all over in India.
- 50. To arrange and organise Seminar, workshops, Counselling and awareness camps, to aware people about Dengu, Maleria, Chicken-gunia and all other diseases.
- 51. To work upon health nutrition, mother and child welfare projects and to organize camps and to open dispensaries based on Ayurvedic, Homeopathic, Unani and Acupressure treatment.
- 52. To combat the menace of consumption of alcohol and drugs by creating awareness and education people about the ill effects of alcohol and drug abuse and to evolve cultural specific modes for prevention of drug abuse and treatment and rehabilitation of drug addicts including involvement in the control programs of STD/HIV/AIDS crisis.
- 53. To provide sound education and Skill development education to children of all communities irrespective of their race, religion, caste or creed in general and to prepare them to become mature and responsible citizens of the country through all-round physical, intellectual, academic, moral and spiritual development based on values derived from life.
- 54. To give utmost importance for free education to the children of slum dwellers by running non formational education centers, remedial education centers and bridge education centre etc.

- 55. To provide facilities for the study and research in the fields of computer and management Education, Training and consultancy.
- 56. To make efforts for the social and Educational development of women, children and backwards in the Rural areas.
- 57. To arrange and manage the training institutions in Typing, English Speaking course, Academic classes, Competition classes, Short hand, computer, Cinema, Media, fine Arts, Crafts, Music, Painting, Siali, Kadai, Beautician, Modeling, Dancing, yoga, physical Education and in other professional training subjects.
- 58. To empower under privileged section of society (Socially, economically weaker section, SC & ST, Physically and mentally challenged; distress women, orphan, senior citizens etc.) by social work, education medical and health care, awareness, vocational training, income generation programmers, counseling and guidance.
- 59. To create awareness about Traffic Rules/Road Safety Rules and also to run various Road Safety programmes and also to assist the Transport Department in this connection.
- 60. To arrange, propagate and organize camps in rural and urban areas on 'Grow more plants', 'Save mother Earth', 'Water conservation', 'Energy conservation' 'Use alternative sources of Energy like Solar energy', Use Bio diesel', Bio-Technology, 'Global warming'.
- 61. To work in the area of preservation of natural eco-system, pollution control, bio-diversity conservation, afforestation, environment management, watershed management, reclamation of problematic soil and alternative energy programs.
- 62. To impart Scholarships and help to deserving students and to grant/give awards and prizes for their excellent academic and co-curricular performance.
- 63. To carry out various program and schemes of Ministry of handicrafts and Ministry of Textile, Rastriya Mahila Kosh, Ministry of Labor, Ministry of social justice and empowerment, Rajiv Gandhi Foundation and for Foundation Directorate of Industries and related program of developing and under developed areas.
- 64. To help to the hopeless, poor and needy children specially to the handicapped children.
- 65. To start various programmes against Child labour and take up effective but reasonable and lawful steps in this connection for the welfare of children.
- 66. To provide food, clothes, Medical aid to needy people.
- 67. To make adequate arrangements and start the rehabilitation centres for widows, old men and women, poor beggars, handicapped, blinds, deaf, dumb mentally challenged people and for other needy people.
- 68. To organise activities related to the health and Sanitation in the villages by adopting the modern methods for the better health of the people and to conduct the concerned authorities.
- 69. To establish and run Yoga and Meditation Research Institute to provide indepth and formal education on Yoga, meditation and related fields and also to offer higher and professional degrees in these fields.









- 70. Encourage games/sports/gymnastic/judo/hockey/football, cricket and other games for the improvement of health among youths and children on the whole providing play ground sports club indoor stadium, training centers and also organize the tournaments. Youth sports competitions on block, district, state and national level.
- 71. To provide relief and assistance of people in any part of the country who are the victims of war or act of nature disaster, man made disaster, trouble or catastrophe in particular by the supply of medical aid to such persons.
- 72. To receive loans, financial and non financial assistance from Govt. Non Govt. organization, International agencies, banks and any other legal entity or individual.
- 73. To engage, employ or hire appropriate staff, workers, legal or other professionals, attorneys, managers and agents for the work and furtherance of the aims and objects of the Trust and to pay their wages, salaries, stipends or fees.
- 74. To accept donations, grants, presents, gifts and other offerings in the shape of movable and/ or immovable properties for the attainment of the aims and objects of the Trust.
- 75. To promote literacy, cultural and other social activities of awareness programs, adult education classes, lecturers, essay competitions exhibitions, symposium, cultural programs, press conferences and seminars.
- 76. To raise funds and resources for the attainment of any of the aim and objects of the Trust by all lawful means including investment of the funds donations, fund raising campaigns, cultural programs, sale of literature, property development, rent from the building etc.
- 77. Trust will invest its money and funds according to Section-11(5) of the Income Tax Act, 1961.

[7] The founder shall appoint any employee i.e. Manager, Supervisor, Legal Advisor and legal assistant, accountant, cashier, peon, chowkidar etc. He has also the powers to terminate the services of any staff as he may deem fit and proper for the benefit of the Trust.

### 18 MEETING OF THE BOARD:

That Board of Management shall meet at least two times in a year time to time or found by Trust. Not less than 15 days notice shall be given of a meeting of the Board of Management. In case of urgency, the meeting may be called by Chairman and the notice time will be according to situation.

b)Each member of the above body including the Chairman shall have one vote and decision at the meeting of the Board shall be taken by majority. In case of a tie, the Chairman shall have a casting vote.

c)Every meeting of the above body shall be presided over by the Chairman and in his absence member respective to preside the meeting.

d)Any business necessary may be carried out by circulatory an appropriate resolution among its member and resolution so circulated and approved by simple majority shall be as effective and binding as if such resolution had been passed at the meeting of the Board of the Management.

[9] The founder/supreme Head/Chairman/ Shaji Jacob will be the absolute in-charge of the Trust and will exercise all the Discretionary and sovereign powers.

[10] It is hereby declared that no part of the Trust property or its income shall be applied for any purpose other than the objects of the Trust as understood under the Income Tax Act, for the time being in force, and the surplus funds if any of the Trust shall be invested as per the provided the Income Tax Act.

[11] The number of the Trustees shall not be less than Two and not more than fifty one. The Trustess shall be trustees for their life time but any Trustee may resign by giving in writing to the Co-trustees, Appointment of Trustees(s) shall be only with the final approval of Settler/her nominee(s) or the successor(s).

[12] The general management and control of the Trust properties and its affairs shall be vested in the Trustees and the Trustees shall have power to do the all such acts as may be considered necessaryfor the benefit of the Trust and/or management of its properties and affairs. Veto Power shall always remain with Settler, Nominees or the Successor(s).

[13] All the Trustees (including Executive trustee/founder) shall form the 'BOARD OF TRUSTEES' and all the decisions shall be taken in the meeting of Board of Trustees called form time to time. Without prejudice to any of the powers that the Trustees may have under any law for the time being in force or to their general powers for management, the Trustees shall have the following powers:

(a) To manage the Trust, the Trust fund, Trust property and other affairs relating to the Trust and to do all acts, deed and things necessary for the preservation, maintenance and management thereof and the affairs relating thereto or connected therewith, including the making of Rules and Regulations from time to time.







- (b) To apply any part of the Trust fund in acquiring moveable/immovable properties and sell, mortgage, alienate or otherwise dispose off the same as they may thing fit and proper.
- (c) To take on rent or lease, purchase or construct building and to construct, add, alter demolish, maintain, sell, dispose off, alienate or otherwise deal with any property moveable or immovable comprising the Trust fund, for the achievement of the Objects of the Trust.
- (d) To let out, demise any moveable or immovable property comprised in the Trust fund for such period and at such rent discretion may think fit.
- (e) To acquire purchase, change, transfer transpose or otherwise deal with all or any of the investments including shares, stocks, debentures, Govt. Securities belonging to the Trust or representing the Trust fund and to re-invest the same as the Trustees may deem fit and proper in accordance with the provisions of Income Tax Act.
- (f) To apply and get registered under Sec. 12A, 80G, FCRA (and under other sec.) of the Income Tax Act.
- (g) To accept donations, Govt. Aid, contributions, gifts and/or other grant-in-aid either in money or in kind.
- (h) To enter into any contract and borrow money for the proposes of the Trust and management of its properties and assets.
- (i) Financial year shall be from 1st April to 31st March, every year.
- (j) To open accounts(s) and give directions to transfer, endorse and sign government securities, promissory notes, shares, debentures, securities, instruments etc. and all these accounts shall be operated by the Trustees jointly and/or severally as decided by them but the decision of the Founder/Nominee(s) or the successor(s) shall be final.
- (k) Bank Accounts shall be operated by joint signatures of Settler/National Chairman/Shaji Jacob and Cashier/Mobin V M.
- (I) To appoint Sub-committees comprising one Trustee or more for carrying out objects and purposes of Trust or matters connected with Trust and/or its affairs.

(m) The Founder shall appoint Following committees:-

(o) To Institute suits, actions and legal proceedings, to prefer appeals, to make applications or petitions, and to give affidavits, wherever necessary and to defend or compound, compromise, abandon, submit to arbitration or otherwise settle any suit, action, claim, legal proceedings, appeal, demand or dispute relating to the Trust matters.



(p) To keep proper accounts of the Trust fund and its property.

(q) To apply to whole or any part of the Trust Fund (corpus and/or income) or property for the objects and purposes of the Trust and to set apart the whole or part of income of the corpus or part thereof for any of the objects of Trust.

(r) To amalgamate the Trust with other institution, association, Trust or organization having Public Charitable objects and purposes with the consent of two third of Trustees in writing.

(s) To nominate, appoint and constitute attorney(s), legal practitioners agents etc. and to delegate the duties and powers vested in them (Trustees) with regard to the management of the Trust property including starting or defending of legal proceedings or for opening or operating upon accounts with any bank(s), person(s), firm(s) or to such other acts and duties relating to or connected with the Trust property as may be deemed necessary.

(t) To appoint/nominate patrons and to give such other designations to various persons extending help for the running or for the case of the Trust.

(u) And generally to do all acts, deeds and things as may be necessary for administration of the Trust.

[14] The Trustees will not be entitled to receive the remuneration as Trustees but may reimburse themselves of all expenses actually incurred by them in connection with Trust or their dues thereto.

[15] The Trustees may from time to time, frame Rules for the conduct of the administration of the Trust and regulating the meetings of Trustees. In the absence of such regulations:-

(i) all the matters will be decided by the majority and the quorum for the meeting shall be two third.

(ii) a resolution circulated to all Trustees and signed by majority of such Trustees, shall be as valid and effectual as resolution duly passed at a meeting of Trustees.

[16] That regular accounts will be maintained relating to all receipts, payments, income, expenditure or any property or liabilities relating to the Trust. Further the accounts of the Trust will be audited by a qualified accountant.

[17] The Board of Trustees shall be entitled to sue in the name of Trust and may similarly be sued in the name of Trust.

[18] The dissolution of the Trust may be affected be a Special Resolution passed by a majority of three-fourth of the Trustees present at the Special meeting convened for

the purpose and with the consent of the President of the Trust there remains after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities, any property whatsoever, the same shall not be paid or distributed amongst the Trustees of the Trust, but shall be given or transferred to some other like Institutions having same Aims and Objects to be determined by the Board of Trustees at or before the time of dissolution.


